Planning is underway for the March 19-21, 2010, LEAD Conference to be held at the Fiesta Resort and Conference Center in Tempe, AZ, a suburb of Phoenix. The LEAD Conference is designed for National Honor Society (NHS), National Junior Honor Society (NJHS) and National Association of Student Council (NASC) students and advisers.

The theme for the LEAD Conferences is "**Energize Your Leadership!**" The conferences offer attendees an opportunity to *experience leadership, explore new ideas, and exchange concepts and resources with other leaders from around the country.*

What is LEAD? LEAD Conferences provide the vehicle for students to apply skills, develop character, learn responsible behavior, enhance communication skills, and take part in activities to strengthen their leadership skills. Activity advisers also have a full program providing them with professional development and the tools essential to manage student activities. LEAD Conferences are approved to provide 1.1 CEU Credits for 11 hours of continuous educational training. Advisers attending the LEAD Conference may earn CEU Credits.
